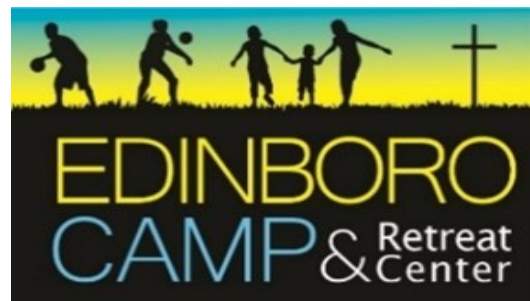

What you should know:

Edinboro Camp:

To glorify God by providing opportunities for followers of Christ to strengthen their spiritual walk through sound Biblical teachings and enriching Christian fellowship.

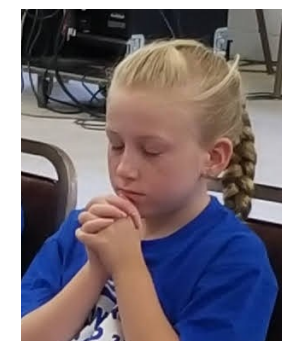
To reach out from a relationally Christ-centered environment to those who have yet to accept Jesus as their Savior and introduce them to Him.

Cell phones (there is no wi-fi and limited cell reception), electronics, knives, or weapons

Discounts:

We offer the following discounts:

- ◆ First time overnight camper discount = \$35 off (not applicable for Day Campers)
- ◆ Multi-child discount—When registering three or more children from the same household, there is a \$25 discount for the third child and beyond.

Details:

Unless otherwise noted, our camp schedule is:

- ◆ Registration and drop off: Sundays 6:00-6:30 pm
- ◆ Closing event with parents: Fridays 6:00 pm
- ◆ Check out: Fridays 7:00 pm

Day Camp:

- ◆ Check in each morning at 9:00 am.
- ◆ Check out each afternoon at 5:00 pm.
- ◆ Lunch may be purchased for an additional \$25 for the week.
- ◆ There will be an option to spend the night Thursday for an additional \$15.

***Base Camp:** Teens will go on physically demanding excursions such as rock climbing, water activities, hiking, etc.

FURTHER DETAILS:

Your child may qualify for two different age groups. Edinboro Camp allows campers who have had a birthday within six months of camp to choose the older or younger camp. For example: a camper who is 9 but will be turning 10 in September can go to the 8 and 9 camp or opt to attend the 10 and 11 camp week; however, you must be at least 6 years old to attend Day Camp

Homesickness/Visiting Campers/Phone Calls:

Homesickness is sometimes an issue, but we have found that campers deal with homesickness much better if they don't see their parents or someone else's parents. So we do not encourage visitation during the week. If you feel it is to the camper's benefit that you should visit or call them, please call the Executive Director, Pastor Dan Borchert, at 814-882-9816 and make arrangements. For the safety of all the campers, no visitors are allowed without making arrangements with the director. Thank you!

Edinboro Youth Camps are open to anyone who wants to attend regardless of nationality, race, ethnic background, gender, religious affiliation, church denomination, or no religious or church affiliation.

Camp Standards: We reserve the right to set standards of conduct for all campers.

Campers who violate these standards may be subject to immediate dismissal at parent's expense.

Refuse Admittance: We reserve the right to refuse admittance to any camp week or event based on camp-determined justifiable cause.

Lost and found items will be held for two weeks and may be picked up within that time frame.

Medications: All camper prescription medications must be brought to camp in their original container and turned in at registration. Over the counter medications must also be turned in at registration.

No meals will be served on check-in nights. However, the snack shop will be open that evening for purchases.
